ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- A complete LL.M. application should include:
- an application form submitted online via LSAC
 - an application fee
 - a personal statement
 - a curriculum vitae
 - official academic records
 - two letters of recommendation
 - a TOEFL score of 100 or IELTS score of 7.0

ADMISSIONS PROCESS

Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis, with decisions announced within three weeks of submission of a complete application. Depending on the individual applicant, decisions could continue into May or June.

Scholarship Opportunities

AFRICAN LEGAL IMPACT SCHOLARSHIP

Full-Tuition Credit for Students from Africa

Developed to encourage enrollment of students from Africa seeking advanced legal education. Two awards available for academically qualified students. Complete LL.M. application due by November 15.

ASIA PACIFIC SCHOLARSHIP

\$15,000 Tuition Credit for Students from Underrepresented Asian Countries

Developed to encourage enrollment of students from the following countries in the Asia/Pacific region: India, Indonesia, Malaysia, The Maldives, The Philippines, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, Thailand, and Vietnam.

GLOBAL REACH SCHOLARSHIP

\$15,000 Tuition Credit for Students from Underrepresented Countries

Developed to encourage enrollment of students from countries that have not ever been, or have rarely been, represented in the program.

LEAST DEVELOPED COUNTRIES SCHOLARSHIP

\$20,000 Tuition Credit for Students from UN-Designated LDC Countries

Developed to encourage enrollment of students from Least Developed Countries, as defined by the United Nations.

LATIN AMERICA SCHOLARSHIP

\$10,000 Tuition Credit for Students from Underrepresented Latin American Countries

Developed to encourage enrollment of students from Latin American countries underrepresented in the program.

PUBLIC LAW SCHOLARSHIP

\$15,000 Tuition Credit for Government/Public Lawyers

Developed to increase diversity of practice in Berkeley Law's LL.M. program by encouraging enrollment of students working as government/public lawyers.

The Degree

The professional track was designed specifically for lawyers educated outside the U.S. who want to earn an internationally renowned Berkeley Law LL.M. degree but choose to complete their studies over two consecutive summer sessions, rather than a full standard academic year. Students participate exclusively with other LL.M. students in smaller classes and professional development activities that are tailored specifically for the LL.M. professional track program. The professional track's format lends itself to creating close bonds with fellow students who become an invaluable global professional network.

The Format

Students in our professional track take courses at Berkeley Law, May through August, over two consecutive summers. Each summer, students can choose to begin in either May (for a 13 week term) or June (for a 10 week term). Courses are intensive, which means they are taught over fewer weeks with more class time each week. Most courses are about 3 weeks in duration, followed immediately by a final exam. Because of the intensive format, students complete 1-2 courses every 3 weeks.

The Coursework

Students complete mandatory courses in Fundamentals of U.S. Law and Legal Research and Writing, and then may customize their studies by choosing from a curated subset of Berkeley Law's most popular courses. Students may focus their studies to earn a Certificate of Specialization and/or to meet the requirements to become eligible to register for the California Bar Examination.
